

Many Farms High School Dress Code Policy



Students are required to conform to the MFHS Dress Code from the time they arrive on school property (including school bus) until they depart from school property. This includes the homeliving program, breakfast, lunch, dinner, before and after school, and school-sponsored activities while on school premises.

- Logos/graphics on clothing (tops/bottoms) and accessories (such as backpacks, purses, bags, belts, shoes, wristbands, shoelaces, coats, head gear, gloves) must be school- and Diné-appropriate: no foul language, no skulls, no sexual innuendo, no references to sex, drugs, alcohol, and/or death.
- Bottoms/Lower Body Clothing (pants, short cuts, skirts) must fit at the waist line and should be no shorter than 3 inches from the knee to the bottom of the hem.
- Tank Tops and Tube Tops are not allowed.
- No one will be allowed to wear a solid blue shirt with blue pants or a solid red shirt with red pants.
- No cleavage, bellies, shoulders or backsides should be exposed, nor should undergarments be visible.
- Clothing should be free of flesh-exposing rips or slits.
- Leggings/jeggings are not pants and should not be worn as pants. Leggings can be worn under a tunic, skirt, or dress.
- No flip-flops, sandals, or stiletto heels are allowed in the science labs or in P.E., Construction Trades, & Agriculture Science classes.
- Gang-related attire and accessories are prohibited.
- No chains, spikes, brads, or any other accessory or adornment which may be used as a weapon or which may damage school property are permitted.
- Face painting, masks, or clothing that hides one's identity is not allowed. Hair must not cover eyes.
- Head gear (hat, hood, beanie, visor) is not to be worn in any building on campus during school hours.
- Headphones/earbuds are to be kept out of sight while in any building on campus.

Students not adhering to the Dress Code will be asked to correct the violation without delay. Refusal to conform to the Dress Code may result in confiscation of the offending object/article of clothing and/or the student being assigned to Lunch Detention or Working Lunch. Repeated documented Dress Code violations may result in permanent confiscation of the offending object/article of clothing and the student being sent home to return to school with parent for Administrative Conference and Behavior Contract.

The School Administration has the final authority in determining appropriate school attire and appearance.

The Many Farm High School Dress Code is subject to change at any time upon Administrative Review.
